She is also President of the International Union of Anthropological & Ethnological Sciences (IUAES, 2013-2018). She is the author of *Outsider Within: Reworking Anthropology in the Global Age* (U Illinois Press, 2008) and editor of *Decolonizing Anthropology: Moving Further toward an Anthropology for Liberation* (AAA 1991), and numerous articles and book chapters.
